As a result the Citizens Observation Patrol was shut down from April until late August. District 9 logged 176 patrol hours on South Hutchinson Island. The majority of our activity involved dogs on the beaches and in the parks, and unregistered golf carts. To drive a golf cart on the island it must be registered with a license plate and the driver must have a valid driver's license. The FPPD is now issuing citations for golf cart/slow moving vehicle violations. We have brochures issued by the city that outline the requirements to convert a golf cart into a slow moving vehicle which would be legal. If you have any questions flag me down as I pass on the street I will be happy to talk and give you a brochure.
